- c) If the Applicant/EAP elects to follow this optional pre-application consultation process, it is required to submit together with this consultation form any correspondence relating to the alleged unlawful commencement of the listed activity/ies or waste management activity/ies. Such correspondence may include inter alia administrative enforcement pre-notices and notices in terms of the NEMA and NEM:WA as well as letters confirming commencement from the relevant authorisations authorities (i.e. EIA and Waste etc.) in terms of the above Acts.
- d) The Department will acknowledge receipt of the Consultation Form (within **14 days**) and provide the Applicant / EAP with the relevant reference number to be used in the pre-application public participation processes.
- e) Upon receipt of this Consultation Form, the Department will advise the applicant/EAP on the pre-application public participation process to be followed in terms of Regulation 8 of the Regulations relating to the procedure to be followed and criteria to be considered when determining an appropriate fine in terms of section 24G, Government Gazette, 20 July 2017 (No. R. 698) ("Section 24G Fine Regulations, 2017") and the information requirements as outlined in Annexure A of the Section 24G Fine Regulations, 2017 that is to be submitted with an application.

An access dirt road was also extended over the dam wall, with culverts over the new dam's spillway, in order to access the south-eastern part

of the property. The access road over the dam wall will be formalised in order continue with the agricultural activities on the farm. The dirt road, once completed, will be approximately 710m long to the south-eastern side of the property. This is a dirt road that gives access to a number of farms in the district. When the drainage line is in flood, the road is under water, with the result that vehicles are getting stuck and unable to access the surrounding farms.

The in-stream dam has a storage capacity of approximately 4000m³ and has a development footprint of approximately 2881m². The unlawful in-stream dam was constructed for the watering of livestock on the farm. The farm is used for grazing sheep. Farm Rhenosterug No. 422 already has been allocated an existing legal water use out of the adjacent Berg River. Please refer to figure 1 - 2 below for the site layout.

The applicant commenced with the construction of an in-stream dam on Farm Rhenosterug No. 422, Riebeek Kasteel, for the in-stream storage of water to be used for watering livestock on the farm.





Figure 3: Crop Census Map – The site (red polygon) and road (yellow) line is located within an agricultural area that mainly specilaises in grain production as well as small grain gazing.

The site has no vegetation cover present is completely transformed from its natural state due to past agricultural development activities on the property. The original vegetation on Farm 422 was Swartland Shale Renosterveld, according to the SANBI webpage. This vegetation type is critically endangered, with 90% of it lost, mainly because of agriculture and some of it because of urban development. The 26% conservation target is now unattainable. 


Figure 5: National Vegetation Map – The site would historically be covered with Swartland Shale Renosterveld. This is a Critically Endangered vegetation type / ecosystem. However, the site has no indigenous vegetation present.




Figure 6: Ecosystems Threat Status Map - The site is located within the Fynbos Ecosystem (Swartland Shale Renosterveld), which is has a threat status that's Critically Endangered.




Figure 7: Biodiversity Sensitivity Map – The site (red polygon) is located within an Ecological Support Area (ESA), and is not located within a Critical Biodiversity Area (CBA).

The site was in a degraded state, with no natural vegetation present on site during the construction which commenced on **28 May 2018** and completed on **14 June 2018**. The site was in a transformed state and is located adjacent to an existing access road. The unlawful commencement of the development of the in-stream dam had no impact on Swartland Shale Renosterveld vegetation. Swartland Shale Renosterveld has a threat status that is Critically Endangered. The site is located within an Ecological Support Area (ESA) and not within a Critical Biodiversity Area (CBA). Please refer to figures 5 – 7 above for more detail.

2. SOCIO-ECONOMIC CONTEXT

2.1 Socio-Economic Context (Pre-Commencement)

Riebeek West is a small town situated about 75 km north-east of Cape Town and 5 km north of its twin town Riebeek Kasteel in the Swartland area of the Western Cape. Riebeek Kasteel is located within the Swartland Municipality, and of those aged 20 years and older, 7,8% have completed primary school, 35,4% have some secondary education, 24,2% have completed matric, and 9,6% have some form of higher education (STATS SA, 2011). Afrikaans is the most spoken language in the municipality (76,2%), followed by Xhosa at 8,2%. Only 4,3% of the population has English as a first language, with other languages making up the remaining 9,9% (STATS SA, 2011). A total of 40 651 people is economically active (employed or unemployed but looking for work), and of these, 12,7% are unemployed. The economically active youth (15–34 years) in the area total 18 248, of which 17,9% are unemployed (STATS SA, 2011).

The majority of people living in Riebeek Kasteel is employed in the agricultural sector.

2.2 Socio-Economic Context (Post-Commencement)
