- 3. This OPTIONAL **Consultation Form** may be completed for all potential section 24G applications to be submitted to the Department in terms of **the above Acts**, by an independent Environmental Assessment Practitioner ("EAP")/Applicant.
- 4. This Consultation Form is current as of April 2018.
- 5. Unless protected by law, all information contained in and attached to this Consultation Form may become public information on receipt by the competent authority.

- a) This Consultation Form may be submitted to the Department at the postal address given below or by delivery thereof to the Registry Office of the Department.
- b) Two signed hard copies (including the original) of this consultation form are to be submitted.
- c) If the Applicant/EAP elects to follow this optional pre-application consultation process, it is required to submit together with this consultation form any correspondence relating to the alleged unlawful commencement of the listed activity/ies or waste management activity/ies. Such correspondence may include inter alia administrative enforcement pre-notices and notices in terms of the NEMA and NEM:WA as well as letters confirming commencement from the relevant authorisations authorities (i.e. EIA and Waste etc.) in terms of the above Acts.
- d) The Department will acknowledge receipt of the Consultation Form (within **14 days**) and provide the Applicant / EAP with the relevant reference number to be used in the pre-application public participation processes.
- e) Upon receipt of this Consultation Form, the Department will advise the applicant/EAP on the pre-application public participation process to be followed in terms of Regulation 8 of the Regulations relating to the procedure to be followed and criteria to be considered when determining an appropriate fine in terms of section 24G, Government Gazette, 20 July 2017 (No. R. 698) ("Section 24G Fine Regulations, 2017") and the information requirements as outlined in Annexure A of the Section 24G Fine Regulations, 2017 that is to be submitted with an application.

The unlawful development in terms of NEMA includes the clearance of approximately 7,42ha of indigenous vegetation, over two separate areas, for the establishment and expansion of agricultural lands (avocados and macadamia nuts).

The Applicant has established 5.42ha of avocados and 2.78ha of macadamia nut, requiring the removal of approximately 7,42ha of indigenous vegetation (parts of the avocado crops was on previously cultivated lands)

A small farm dam (~900m³) has also been constructed within an area identified as a wetland.




Figure 2: SANBI Red List of Ecosystems Remnants and Vegetation Map (2018). The red polygons indicate the areas of indigenous vegetation that was cleared.

The Duiwenhoks River flow just south of Area 2, a small drainage line to the west of Area 1 and the Sanddrift River to the east of the dam.




Figure 4: Freshwater Resources. The dam was constructed within an area identified as a natural wetland according to the NFEPA Maps.

The cleared areas are within close proximity to a drainage line, and the Duiwenhoks River.

The establishment of the crops has led to the clearance of approximately 7.42ha of indigenous vegetation (Garden Route Shale Fynbos - Endangered). Both areas are also within a CBA1. A Botanical Impact Assessment will be conducted.

The dam has been constructed within an area identified as a natural wetland according to the NFEPA, although no remnants of the wetland are visible in the area. A freshwater assessment will be conducted.
